Background Information	<p>With the introduction of 88(R), HB 1819, juvenile curfew ordinances are no longer allowed. Specifically, Chapter 370, Local Government Code, is amended by adding 370.007 to read as follows:</p> <p>JUVENILE CURFEWS PROHIBITED. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a political subdivision may not adopt or enforce an order, ordinance, or other measure that imposes a curfew to regulate the movements or actions of persons younger than 18 years of age.</p> <p>(b). This section does not apply to a curfew implemented under Chapter 418, Government Code, for purposes of emergency management.</p>
