She stated the amendment focuses on Luck road improvements, including upgrades to the park, road, and utilities. improvements involve the plat, parking lot, turning lanes, and road widening, with the project scheduled to begin in July 2025.

Mayor Ritchie called Lissette Jimenez, Director of **Parks** & Recreation. on Director Jimenez presented an updated construction cost for Northside citing increases in inflation, interest rates, and construction costs. As in phases will now be completed two requires additional project and support in the form of a Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR). She outlined the responsibilities the CMAR will manage for the city and parks department, emphasizing that the city and parks will remain involved in all aspects of the project but are seeking additional assistance.

Mayor Ritchie called on Kristy Stark, Assistant City Manager. ACM Stark relationship with presented the city's the Normandy Group, emphasizing on

the benefits of maintaining this partnership through a three-year contract. She explained that when the city is not awarded a grant, the Normandy Group provides debriefs to help improve future applications. ACM Stark also reviewed the grants the city has received, including the most recent one, which will fund the hiring of six new firefighters.
