SUMMARY	The Boerne Police Department has an officer assigned to the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) Task Force out of San Antonio, Texas. This task force not only works in the San Antonio area, but surrounding communities including Boerne. This partnership is a nationwide initiative that removes the tools of crime from criminal organizations, deprives wrongdoers of the proceeds of their crimes, recovers property that may be used to compensate victims, and acts as a crime deterrent. The officer assigned to the DEA has assisted in local crimes and removing drugs from our community, which is one of our goals to make this a safer community. In the future we hope to obtain funds from his assignment at the task force to offset the salary of the officer and future equipment expenditures. As you can see at this point, we have not met our goal of covering the cost of the officer. I have met with the Special Agent in Charge of the local DEA and discussed our concerns. In addition, I have had conversations with the City Manager. The amount received for 2015 was \$22,524.10 which covers about a third of the officer's salary. The Department of Justice (DOJ) requires an audit be completed and we must complete the Equitable Sharing Agreement and Certification form; form OMB1123-0011. This form must be completed with 60 days after FY 2014/15.
