Mr. Thatcher reviewed the history of city council stipends dating back to 1925 and provided comparisons with other cities. He noted that any increase would not take effect until after the next election of the mayor and council members. The Council reached а consensus to further forward with with discussion scheduled for the an increase, second council meeting in October which will be a special called meeting on October 27.

B. PRESENTATION OF PROPOSED UPDATES TO THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE.

Mayor Ritchie called on Nathan Crane, Planning Director. Director Crane provided updates the Unified Development Code (UDC) proposed to which primarily focus the compliance with recently adopted legislation. on These changes will need to go before the Planning and Zoning Commission before the City Council may take action.

Thatcher recognized Larry Woods, Director of Visit Boerne, City Manager Marion Szurek Leadership receiving the Award, which honors significant contributions in marketing, advertising, and tourism development. Director Woods shared additional details about the award with the Council.

Assistant City Manager Kristy Stark presented highlights from the Special Session, summarizing key legislation impacting cities, including bills that were approved and those that did not pass.

City Manager Thatcher provided the status on various city projects.

Mayor Pro Tem Wolosin noted that the Texas Craft Brewers Guild hold "roundup" meeting at The The Guild their next Bevy in Boerne. hosts two with meetings each their annual conference in Austin; vear, next vear's roundup meeting will bring brewers from across the state to Boerne.

He also addressed a social media post claiming a 45% increase in water rates. The individual who made the post was in attendance earlier but had since left. Staff had previously explained the rate increase in detail, clarifying that the 45% hike applies only to high water users. Mayor Pro Tem Wolosin reminded the audience not to assume social media posts are accurate.

Council Member Macaluso added that for the average homeowner, the water rate increase is minimal-approximately 1%.
