<b>SUMMARY</b>	<p>The City and County entered into an agreement in November of 2000 with the State of Texas to provide food establishment inspections. The State fell out of the system shortly thereafter and since that time the City of Boerne has entered into an Interlocal Agreement yearly with Kendall County to provide health inspections for food establishments in the City of Boerne. We have attached the agreement for your information. The agreement has been the same for a number of years with the exception of Exhibit A, which is the breakdown of total cost including the cost to the City.</p> <p>The work load for the sanitarian increases each year based on growth in the City and County as more food establishments are built. Last year the County hired an Assistant Sanitarian to be able to keep up with the number of locations which need to be inspected. We were made aware of this and presented that information to City Council last year during the approval process as it caused an escalation from \$18,500 to \$39,082.</p> <p>In our budget process, we included a cost for Sanitarian services at \$39,082 based on last year's numbers and having not heard from the County. However, last month we received notification from the County that the Commissioners Court had approved a Sanitarian Agreement which escalated the cost to the City to \$45,041 from \$39,082. The escalation comes from the fact that the Assistant Sanitarian was hired in January and impacted 9 months of the prior budget versus 12 months in the new budget.</p>

	At this time we are asking Council to make a determination as to which amount the City should pay as part of approval of the agreement.
