<b>SUMMARY</b>	<p>City Planning staff has been working on our annexation plan for the coming year to include “filling in the white gaps on the map,” as well as contemplation of strategic annexation which makes sense for the future growth of the City. In addition, Chris Turk has been contacting property owners on the City’s southwest side to determine interest in voluntary inclusion in the City’s Extraterritorial Jurisdiction (ETJ). The purpose of this is to attempt to form a “Boerne wall” on the City’s Southwest side similar to the one in existence on the Southeast side which has been in place for 20 years. San Antonio’s announced annexation plans are aggressive and the City has been contacted by several citizens on both the Southwest and Southeast sides regarding those proposed annexations stating they did not wish to be in San Antonio or its ETJ.</p> <p>The map attached (Map #1) shows the City’s white space gaps that are surrounded by the City limits. The other maps (Map #2 and #3) show City limits, ETJ, and ETJ extensions.</p>
