**1. CALL TO ORDER – 6:00 PM**

Mayor Schultz called the City Council to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Schultz asked for a Moment of Silence and led the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag and to the Texas Flag.

Mayor Schultz stated that agenda item #16 will be moved up in the agenda in front of agenda item #7.

**2. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST**

Mayor Schultz stated that he has a conflict of interest with agenda item 10 and will recuse himself from the discussion.

### **3. PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Glenn Cummings, 120 Doeskin Drive discussed the inconsistencies with Kendall Appraisal District's property appraisals. He has met with Shelby Presley, Chief Appraiser and members of the Board of Directors. He has also communicated with state authorities regarding his concerns. He will keep the City Council informed if requested.

George Lewis, 130 Ranch Drive resides in the area of the new subdivision Southglen. He discussed concerns with potential traffic problems at Cascade Caverns Road and Ranch Drive once the approximate 250 homes are built. He distributed a handout to the Council Members regarding "Potential Traffic Problems".

Peter Nehen, part owner of Fuzzy's Tacos spoke on the sign variance request for the new business located on Hwy 46 East. He stated that the large trees obscure the building frontage from Hwy 46. He asked that the City Council take that into consideration when voting on the sign variance request.

Scott Wilson, 31480 IH 10 stated that he was in favor of the new City Hall project and that the community deserves a new City Hall to serve the City for years to come.

Darold Kruse, 123 Ranch Drive has lived at this location since 1976. He stated that a lot of people are moving to Boerne and he is concerned about the roads. He also stated that the City should make provisions to improve the roads before subdivisions are developed.

Roy Faz, 102 Old San Antonio Road spoke on the proposed rezoning of 44 and 46 Old San Antonio Road. He stated that he was opposed to a contractor next door to his property and feels that the commercial property in the area is taking away green space.

Elizabeth Carol, 9314 Jorwoods, San Antonio spoke on the proposed rezoning of 44 and 46 Old San Antonio Road. She stated that she is representing the applicant. The proposed zoning is consistent with the City's Master Plan. She asked that the City Council approve the proposed rezoning.

Vicki Moore, 46 Old San Antonio Road spoke on the proposed rezoning of 44 and 46 Old San Antonio Road. She stated that the property has been listed since 2013. The majority of the potential buyers are interested in using the

property for business. Commercial zoning is consistent with the issues of high traffic and noise. Most of the properties along Old San Antonio Road are zoned commercial. The property is located across from the Waterwaste Treatment and Recycling Center. The interested buyers want to retain and use the current buildings.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Jeff Thompson, Deputy City Manager. Mr. Thompson displayed a map of the location of the property. The 88.967 acres were recently annexed into the city limits. He stated that City Staff has been in

discussions with the developer of Southglen Subdivision for three years. A traffic impact analysis was completed and Southglen will contribute to roadway improvements. The Planning and Zoning Commission voted 7-0 in favor of the zoning. Staff recommended approval of the proposed zoning.

Mr. Thompson continued with a map of the property located at 44 and 46 Old San Antonio Road. The property owner is requesting the property be rezoned from R-E to B-2 Highway Commercial District. The property will be used for a damage restoration business. One of the existing homes on the property will be used as an office and the other buildings will be used for storage of vehicles. The owner understands that if the property is rezoned commercial, the city will apply the Entrance Corridor Overlay District to it. Mr. Thompson reminded the City Council that after the proposed rezoning is complete, the use of the property will be brought to City Council for consideration. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval by a vote of 6-1. Staff also recommended approval of the rezoning. Discussion ensued regarding signage, Entry Corridor District, existing buildings, and the zoning of the neighboring properties.

**7. [2016-861](#) RECEIVE COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC FORUMS FOR THE NEW CITY HALL PROJECT**

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Linda Zartler, Assistant City Manager to provide

the results from the two Public Forums regarding the New City Hall project. Ms. Zartler displayed the architectural design Option A to include view from Library and Main Street; Option B - a two storey with a 90 degree angled council chambers; and Option C - a three storey which is similar to Option A. Two Public Forums were held with 61 people attending, 55 of which were city residents. A total of 43 people completed the comment cards relating to each Option. Ms. Zartler stated that based on Staff's review, Option A received the most positive comments. A list of the comments were provided to the City Council. Discussion ensued regarding public input being used in the design process, timing of the project, LEED Certified v. LEED Certifiable, energy efficiency, roof pitch used for mechanical storage, and architect's professional opinions. Mr. Randall Scott stated that today there are many more opportunities to build a more efficient building than two years ago in regards to insulation, more efficient mechanical, windows, etc. Mr. Ron Bowman, City Manager stated that Council Members as well as Staff have gone through a beneficial process in order to provide all the answers and resolving concerns. It is important that the building be done right the first time to last 75+ years and it is time to move forward with the project.

Mayor Schultz referred to a book related to historical buildings at the City Council dais. He stated that this is an opportunity for the City Council to make a historic vote on an important building with an expectancy of 75 years. He reminded the City Council that Kendall County built a 44,000 square foot Courthouse building in 1997 and have purchased additional buildings and parking lots since that time. Ms. Zartler stated that with the approval of the contract with Randall Scott Architects, Inc., the City is committed to the design phase and also the process of hiring a Construction Manager at Risk. The schematic design phase process includes workshops and meetings which will be open to the public. It is anticipated that there will be several meetings to finalize the design. It is the Staff's intention to hire a Project Manager to assist in the design selections as well as oversee the day to day construction and serve as the liaison between the architect, the contractor, and the City.

She displayed graphs of the tiers for residential and commercial accounts. Discussion ensued regarding the estimated water usage for a retired couple and a family of four during winter and summer months, and whether GBRA will negotiate the rate. Staff recommended approval on first reading of the Ordinance 2016-37.

He explained that the property owner owns the parking lot as well as the building where the business will be located. Because of the agreement with Walgreens, until the distant future, the parking lot can only be a parking lot. He displayed a diagram of the proposed monument sign. Staff will make sure that the placement of the sign will not obstruct site of the traffic or does not encroach on existing easements or right of ways. The Sign Variance Committee recommended approval of the variance. Discussion ensued regarding consistency in approving or denying variances, location being unique, busy intersection, and additional signage on building.

The owner chose to move forward with the original request. The Sign Variance Committee recommended that the variance be denied.

Several roadway projects were discussed including the Highway 46 East expansion project from Esser to Ammann Road. These improvements would help the mobility needs of expected future growth of homes in the area. In October 2015, the City and County jointly sent a letter to TxDOT expressing the willingness to contribute an equal share of local funding towards the Highway 46 East expansion project. A few months ago, Staff received a notice from TxDOT that they planned to move forward with the project in 2017. It is TxDOT's intention to bid the project in May 2017 therefore requiring the City and County to make the financial contribution in October. The Advanced Funding Agreement (AFA) will be between TxDOT and the City in the amount of \$1.1M. The City and the County will enter into an Interlocal Agreement for joint funding of the project and the County will reimburse the City their share of \$550,000. Discussion ensued regrading widening to four lanes and timeline of the project if the City and County did not contribute.
