Mayor Schultz called the City Council to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Jeff Thompson, Deputy City Manager. Mr. Thompson displayed a map of the location of the property which is across Old San Antonio Road from the new Wastewater Treatment and Recycle Center and neighbor to the new RV park. The existing buildings on the property will be used for office and storage. There are no plans at this time to make changes to the existing structures. The Planning and Zoning Commission voted 7-0 to recommend approval of the use of contractors in a B-2 zone with the following caveats: lighting be no higher than 15 feet, be directed downward and not go off the property, that all material be stored behind solid fencing at least eight feet tall, and that signage be a monument type following city ordinances. Discussion ensued regarding fencing and monitoring to make sure the property owner is in compliance with the ordinance.

Mr. Thompson presented the FY 2017 Economic Development Work Plan. He discussed the work plan initiatives from 2016, the work plan highlights for 2017 which include roadway and mobility projects, downtown and the Hill Country Mile, the Convention and Visitors Bureau, North Main Street/Hwy 87 Development, Boerne Kendall County Economic Development Corporation strategic plan for attraction and business retention and expansion. He reviewed the next steps for the 2017 Work Plan. He asked the City Council to contact him with any input they may have. Discussion ensued regarding the benefits of Public Funding (PFC's).

Mr. Thompson stated that staff recently received a sign variance request for Peggy's on the Green. The request is for the location of the proposed sign to be off-site on the City's property at the entrance of Cibolo Creek Trail. The proposed sign will be 4 feet tall. He displayed a photo of the proposed sign and the proposed location. Mr. Thompson stated that the Staff Sign Variance Committee recommended denial of the request as they did not feel there was a significant advantage of the location or a hardship. Mr. Thompson also stated that Mr. Bowman, in his absence, asked him to relay that he is in support of the variance. Discussion ensued regarding setting precedence, a portion of the Ye Kendall Inn property was deeded to the City by the former owner, driveway parking will obstruct the view of the sign if the sign is located on Ye Kendall Inn property, businesses such as this will help the Historical District and the Hill Country Mile succeed, sandwich board signs, and maintenance responsibility if the sign is located on City property.

For \$1.00 a year and the responsibility to maintain the area, Peggy's on the Green will be allowed to use the site for the sign for five years with automatic renewals. Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Paul Barwick, Special Projects Director. Mr. Barwick introduced Ms. Emily Phalan a representative with GrantWorks, Inc. in the audience. He explained that the City was successful in being awarded a grant for the Trail System Expansion Project. The scope of the project includes two extensions, City Park trail head extending to Cibolo Creek and the connection of the Boerne City Campus to the Old No. 9 Trail. At this time, it is necessary to secure consultant services for the administration of the grant. A Request for Proposal (RFP) was issued and two proposals were received. Staff recommended entering into a consultant services contract with GrantWorks, Inc. for grant administrative services in an amount not to exceed \$74,800.

The property located at 1700 River Road is 21.688 acres. As part of the annexation process, City Council needs to set the date and time for two public hearings.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Mike Mann, Public Works Director. Mr. Mann reminded the City Council of the previously approved Infrastructure Development Agreement with the developer of Southglen Subdivision. The agreement included provisions for City funded oversizing of the offsite gas main along Cascade Caverns Road which will allow flow capacity from the existing gate stations to service anticipated high-growth areas in our service territory. Engineering and construction costs will be \$44,823.97. There also will be some additional costs for increasing the performance bond and possibly some other ancillary cost. Mr. Mann stated that the oversizing project will be less than \$55,000.00. Staff recommended approval of Resolution No. 2016-R102.

Staff has arranged easements and ROW dedication, hired an engineer to design the line relocation project, coordinated with Bandera Electric and GVTC for relocation of the infrastructure, and set the poles for the project. Staff has negotiated a contract with Pike Electric, LLC to complete the installation of the new electric lines along the tops of the recently installed poles at a cost of \$49,009.10. Staff recommended approval of Resolution No. 2016-R103.

Ms. Mattick continued with the agreement for the City's year end audit services. She stated that Padgett Stratemann & Co., LLP who has conducted the City's audit for many years, recently merged with RSM US LLP. RSM provides audit, tax and consulting services focused on the middle market and is ranked 5th largest in the nation. The larger firm will add additional oversight to the audit. RSM has a team of individuals that specialize in accounting services to the public sector. The City will continue to work with individuals from the San Antonio office. The cost for the audit of various funds is \$50,000.00. The cost for the Single Audit required by grantees of Federal Grants is \$5,500.00. Also, to prepare and print the City's CAFR, the fees would be \$11,000.00. Staff plans to prepare the CAFR in-house but RSM US LLP will assist if needed. Staff recommended approval of Resolution No. 2016-R105.

Council Member Boyd recognized Colton Schroeder who resides in Council Member Boyd's district and neighborhood, was awarded Entrepreneur of the Year for Lemonade Day this year and received a \$1,000 scholarship. Council Member Boyd also asked city staff for a document to explain the variance to Ye Kendall Inn allowing the use of a golf cart in the city.

Council Member Anzollitto reported that he attended the AACOG Air Executive Committee meeting and it was asked that all surrounding communities participate with San Antonio in the clean air initiative even though Boerne does not contribute to air pollution in the area. This may be a good way to market Boerne as a clean air city.

Kirsten Cohoon, City Attorney announced that Fabra Elementary also received \$1,000.00 for Lemonade Day for the most participants.
