Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Sandy Mattick, Finance Director. Ms. Mattick presented the Quarterly Financial and Investment Reports. Revenues before transfers were above projection at 35.89%. Expenditures were below projections at 24.22%, sales tax collections were up 3.78% and ad valorem tax collections were at 82.56%. For the Utility Funds: Electric revenues were at 23.68% of budget and expenditures were below projections at 22.72%; Water revenues were at 26.75% of budget and expenditures were below projections at 21.22%; Wastewater revenues were at 25.11% of budget and expenditures were below projections at 22.56%; Gas revenues were at 22.67% of budget and expenditures were below projections at 23.63%. The City of Boerne invested in TexPool, MBIA, Texas TERM, TexStar, Government Agencies, municipal bonds, commercial paper and several Certificates of Deposit. Interest earned for this quarter totaled \$77,720.

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Laura Talley, Director of Planning and Community Development, to discuss the sign variance request received from Southwest Texas Sign Service to allow for more than one freestanding sign at the Methodist Hospital. The Staff Variance Committee met and reviewed the request. The committee determined the sign was more fitting of the definition of a directional sign and reviewed it as such. Subsequently, a new submission was received from Southwest Texas Sign Service modifying the size of the sign by removing blank spaces on the sign. The new request is for a 30 square feet directional sign. The sign requested is what is typically seen at hospitals. Discussion ensued about size, placing restrictions and limiting the amount of signs allowed. The Sign Variance Committee recommended approval of the directional sign and removal of the existing monument sign at this location.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Paul Barwick, Special Projects Director. Mr. Barwick informed Council that Staff has met with Poznecki-Camarillo, Inc. (PCI) and TxDOT to discuss the Trails System Expansion Project. Also, the Design Concept Conference meeting was held January 12, 2017 which went through the entire scope of the project. The total cost of the project from start to finish with PCI will be \$364,328.00 with a scheduled letting date of July 2017. Staff is in support of entering into an agreement with PCI.

The Hometown Connections Organization Check Up program is through American Public Power Association. This is to make sure our policies are consistent with other markets and rates are competitive. There was discussion about whether this program is a good idea and may be carried over with other utilities such as water and wastewater. The outline of the services are covered under the proposal. Staff is supportive of the Organization Check Up.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Mike Mann, Public Works Director. Mr. Mann displayed a map with the location of both the Bentwood and Vista Verde lift stations. Removing both of these lift stations will relieve high flow conditions at the Wastewater Treatment and Recycling Center located on Esser Road. It will also eliminate the need to operate, maintain, or rehabilitate these two lift stations which will be more economical. The first phase will include the construction of new pipelines that will redirect the flows around the existing lift stations. In the second phase, both lift stations will be demolished and the sites restored. Staff is recommending to move forward with an agreement with HDR to design and bid the project.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Jeff Page, Assistant Chief of Police. Assistant Chief Page stated that a new communications tower in the Comfort area is needed at the recommendation of LCRA Engineers, due to transmission issues with the existing tower. A new tower will allow first responders to better communicate with dispatch. The Boerne Police Department provides dispatch services for Boerne Utilities as well as all emergency services in Kendall County. Each entity pays their share of the communications budget based on the percentage of call volume. The Communications Board determined any funds left over in a given year would be placed in a reserve fund and only used on Capital Items that are brought forth before the Board. The Board has never expended funds that only benefited one entity and felt all entities will benefit from a new tower even though it is located in Comfort. Staff is supportive of the expenditure from the Communications Reserve Fund for a new radio tower built in Comfort.

Jeff Thompson, Deputy City Manager, recapped potential proposals for a hotel conference center. Phoenix Hospitality Group (PHG) submitted a new proposal with a five story 7,150 square foot conference facility, a full service restaurant and 120 rooms in the SoBo District.
