Assistant Chief Page stated that a new communications tower in the Comfort area is needed at of recommendation LCRA Engineers, due to transmission issues with existing tower. A new tower will allow first responders to better communicate Police with dispatch. The Boerne Department provides dispatch services Boerne Utilities as well as all emergency services in Kendall County. Each entity pays their share of the communications budget based on the percentage of call volume. The Communications Board determined any funds left over in a given year would be placed in a reserve fund and only used on Capital Items that are brought forth before the Board. The Board has never expended funds that only benefited one entity and felt all entities will benefit from a new tower even though it is located in Comfort. Staff is supportive of the expenditure from the Communications Reserve Fund for a new radio tower built in Comfort.
