City Manager Ron Bowman stated that once a month Staff will brief the City Council on the status of the City Master Plan, Parks Master Plan, and the new City Hall Project.

Mayor Pro Tem Cisneros stated he wanted to clarify his vote at the MPO meeting regarding toll lanes on Highway 1604. He explained that the three lanes on Highway 1604 will remain free and adding two additional lanes that could be HOV and tollway. There is a funding shortfall for the project. He voted in favor of the tolls to help with the shortfall and to prevent projects scheduled for the Boerne area from being delayed due to funding.
