<b>STAFF'S RECOMMENDED ACTION (be specific)</b>	Approve Resolution No. 2017-R43; A Resolution Authorizing The City Manager To Enter Into And Manage An Agreement Between The City Of Boerne And Tw Hicks Industrial Floor Specialists To Refinish The Floors In The Fire Department Not To Exceed \$26,437.00.

<b>SUMMARY</b>	<p>In the FY 2016/2017 budget, Council approved funding to refinish the engine room bay floors in the fire station. Different types of floor finish were explored based on looks, durability and cost. It was determined that an epoxy based floor paint, properly installed, would be our best option for the money. We received three quotes as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. TW Hicks Industrial Floor Specialists - \$26,437</li> <li>2. Element 7 Concrete - \$26,650</li> <li>3. Comcorco US Corp - \$9,785</li> </ol> <p>All three quotes were examined based on references, timeline to complete the work, experience, options, preparation of surface and application of the product.</p> <p>The lowest bid from Comcorco is applying a thinner product and would not be doing the same preparation as the other two. This would most likely shorten the durability and life of the floor. This is also a new company with no references in the area.</p> <p>It is staff's recommendation to allow TW Hicks Industrial Floor Specialists to refinish the floors in the fire department engine room bays for the price of \$26,437.</p>
