Schultz Ms. Community Mayor called on Laura Talley, Planning and Development Director. Ms. Talley displayed а map of the area under consideration. She pointed out the location of the developments planned for the Shooting Club Road area. She explained that Staff would like re-classify Shooting Club Road to be categorized as a secondary collector with 74' of right-of-way. Staff feels it is necessary to re-classify the road now, so the right-of-way is dedicated as the area develops further. Currently the road is rural in nature with no sidewalks or curbs. It is likely that with KWU providing water to the east side of Shooting Club Road. developments may happen in the future with properties subdividing near smaller lots. Discussion ensued regarding Shooting Club Road going from FM 1376 to Main Street and other rules ordinances that apply. Mr. Jeff or Thompson. Deputy City Manager stated that both FΜ 1376 and Hwv 87 are TxDOT maintained roads.
