SUMMARY	Hazard mitigation is the effort to reduce loss of life and property by lessening the impact of disasters. It is most effective when implemented under a comprehensive, long-term mitigation plan. State, tribal, and local governments engage in hazard mitigation planning to identify risks and vulnerabilities associated with natural disasters, and develop long-term strategies for protecting people and property from future hazard events. Mitigation plans are key to breaking the cycle of disaster damage, reconstruction, and repeated damage.	
	The Kendall County Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan consists of the City of Boerne and Kendall County. The city and county are required to submit a hazard mitigation plan every five years to Texas Department of Emergency Management. This revision is amending our previous Hazard Mitigation Plan. To expedite the hazard mitigation plan process the City of Boerne falls under the umbrella of Kendall County.	
	In 2016 Kendall County hired H2O Partners Inc. to assist writing this plan. The hazard mitigation plan is required to be on file in the event a local disaster occurs and the city requests assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). This is not response action, but mitigation action for all 14 hazards identified by city and county Emergency Management personnel. The 14 hazards identified are: Flood, wildfire, drought, extreme heat, thunderstorm wind, tornado, hail, winter storm, dam failure, hurricane, lightning, hazardous materials, pipeline failure, and terrorism. For each hazard the plan presents a description of the hazard, a list of historical hazard events, and the results of the vulnerability and risk assessment process.
