| SUMMARY | The Boerne Housing Authority administers a federal rental assistance program for low income families, elderly residents, and persons with disabilities in the City of Boerne. Currently the Boerne Housing Authority assists 65 families in Boerne. Funds for rental assistance and a portion of their administrative costs come from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The City's funding pays for the balance of the administrative costs to provide this service. We have been assisting with their administrative costs since FY 2012 – 2013. Kendall County provides office space for Boerne Housing Authority. |
