The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) estimates that Americans generate 1.8 million tons of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) per year. The average home can accumulate as much as 120 pounds of HHW in storage areas, garages, and sheds. The average American household has at least 24 electronic products and all of the E-waste recycled in the US every year amounts to more than 100 million pounds of materials, including plastics, metals, glass, and other materials. Many communities have established programs to manage this waste.

For FY 2018-2019, our recommendations are for the City of Boerne to apply for a new grant to maintain the integrity of the program and continue the proper disposal of harmful, toxic waste. At this time, we are requesting Council's approval to apply for the FY 2019 Household Hazardous Waste grant from Alamo Area Council of Governments (AACOG). We anticipate applying for a grant for \$10,000.00. The City anticipates budgeting \$10,000.00 in matching funds for this grant period. A total of \$20,000.00 will be available for advertisement and curbside collection from 9/1/18-6/30/19.
