1. CALL TO ORDER – 6:00 PM

Mayor Schultz called the City Council to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Schultz asked for a Moment of Silence and led the pledge of allegiance to the United States Flag and the Texas Flag.

2. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

No conflicts of interest were declared.

3. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Michael Yost, 140 Ranch Drive spoke against the annexation of 214 Cascade Caverns Road. He feels the annexation will be a detriment to the quality of life

of his neighbors and he expressed concerns with the increase in traffic, drainage, and pollution.

Rod Fowler, 131 Ranch Drive spoke against the annexation of 214 Cascade Caverns Road. He stated that he feels the retention pond is too small and that the engineer has made a mistake regarding the size of the retention pond. He stated concerns that the subdivision will destroy the recharge feature of the property, and that the road is not identified on the Master Plan. He feels there should be a privacy fence around the property.

Milan Michalec, 12 Brandt Road stated that although he is President of the Cow Creek Groundwater Conservation District he was not speaking for the district but on behalf of himself. He spoke on the proposed creation of the Kendall County Water Control and Improvement District No. 3. He provided an article from the Rivard Report to the City Council Members. He stated no groundwater will be used in development. The water will come from Canyon Lake via an agreement with San Antonio Water Systems.

5.A. [2018-271](#) PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF 8.491 ACRES LOCATED AT 45 CASCADE CAVERNS ROAD, KAD NO. 24328, AT THE REQUEST OF CURREY CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH. (Second of two hearings)

Mayor Schultz opened the Public Hearing at 6:08 p.m.

Eric Cate, 9211 Saddle Trail in San Antonio stated that he was speaking for Currey Creek Baptist Church. He explained that a portion of the Church's property is currently in the City limits. The Church wishes to annex the front portion of the property for future growth.

Mayor Schultz closed the Public Hearing at 6:10 p.m.

Rod Fowler, 131 Ranch Road stated he had nothing further to add from his previous comments.

Scott Stolle, 145 Cascade Caverns Road asked that he be provided information on the City Council meeting procedures.

George Lewis, 130 Ranch Drive stated they came to the area in 1973. He built his home in 2000. He agrees with Mr. Fowler's comments.

Mayor Schultz opened the Public Hearing at 6:16 p.m.

Lance Lira, 207 Vista Verde spoke for his mother. His mother has owned the day care located at 946 Adler Street for about 10 years. The property when annexed into the City limits was brought in under a non-confirming use. The rezoning request is to bring the property into conformance based on the City's Zoning Ordinance.

Mayor Schultz closed the Public Hearing at 6:18 p.m.

5.D. [2018-274](#) PROPOSED REZONING OF A PORTION OF 34 SHOOTING CLUB ROAD (4.2 ACRES FRONTING NORTH MAIN STREET, KAD NO. 14943) FROM I, INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT TO B-2R, HIGHWAY COMMERCIAL-RESTRICTED DISTRICT. (Urfan Dar, one of one hearing)

Mayor Schultz opened the Public Hearing at 6:18 p.m.

Philip Bell, 230 English Oaks stated that the property located at 34 Shooting Club Road was once a horse farm. The Texas Star Nut company owns a portion of property. He introduced Urfan Dar in the audience who is the owner requesting the rezoning.

Urfan Dar stated that he wishes to build a medical office on the property. His

plan is to employee physicians, nurses and technicians.

Mayor Schultz closed the Public Hearing at 6:22 p.m.

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Laura Talley, Planning and Community Development Director. Ms. Talley displayed a map of the 1.519 acres located at 946 Adler Street. She explained that before the property was annexed into the City, it was used as a daycare. Currently it remains a daycare which automatically makes it a nonconforming use under the current R-E zone. As a nonconforming use, the owner cannot make any improvements to the property because it is not an approved use. The potential rezoning to B-1 would bring the daycare into conformance. Any improvements made to a commercial site would require permitting which would trigger the need for a drainage study. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the rezoning by a voted of 7-0. Staff also supports the rezoning.

Ms. Talley continued with rezoning of the property located at 34 Shooting Club Road. She displayed a map of the 28.47 acres which is currently zoned industrial. Ms. Talley explained that only 4.2 acres would be rezoned. The property owner is requesting a rezoning to be able to use the 4.2 acres for medical office purpose. The current Zoning Ordinance does support an office use in industrial districts. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the rezoning by a vote of 7-0. Staff also supports the rezoning.

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Sandy Mattick, Finance Director. Ms. Mattick introduced Ms. Janet Pitman, CPA with ABIP, PC to present the results of the annual audit. Ms. Pitman recognized Mr. Jeremy Barbatto, manager of the firm in the audience. Ms. Pitman reviewed the highlights of the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR). She stated that the CAFR is recognized across the United States and affects bond ratings. The Report shows the City of Boerne has a strong financial position with adequate resources to meet its ongoing obligations. Ms. Mattick stated that as in previous years, the CAFR will be submitted for consideration to the Government Finance Officer's Association (GFOA's) Certification of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Report Program. Mayor Schultz spoke on the Deferred Outflows of Resources and Deferred Inflows of Resources Related to Pensions, the 10 year history of ad valorem tax and sales tax, and business type activities and property tax rates. He expressed his appreciation to the Finance Staff.

8. [2018-270](#) PRESENTATION AND UPDATE ON STREET MAINTENANCE AND SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR FY 2017-2018.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Danny Zincke, Community Services Director. Mr. Zincke recognized Victor Longoria, Street Superintendent in the audience. Mr. Zincke stated the City Council recently approved an agreement for street crack sealing and also approved the purchased of a striping machine. He displayed a map and list of the planned city streets to be crack sealed and a map and list of streets that have been striped. He displayed a map and list of potential sidewalk projects. He asked the City Council to prioritize sidewalk projects based on a budget of \$430,000. It was the consensus of the City Council to move forward with any areas involving children safety; both Bentwood bridges, East Blanco between Plant and Becker, City Park Road, and West San Antonio. Discussion ensued regarding restricting access to traffic on City Park Road and drivers cutting through the Kendall County Fairgrounds property to get to Hwy 46 East. Mayor Schultz asked Staff to bring a recommendation to City Council at the next meeting.

9. [2018-269](#) CONSIDER RESOLUTION NO. 2018-R25; A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AND MANAGE THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE GAS MAIN EXTENSION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BOERNE, YMCA OF GREATER SAN ANTONIO AND KENDALL COUNTY.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Mike Mann, Public Works Director. Mr. Mann reminded the City Council that in December 2017, the agreement with the YMCA, Kendall County and the City to extend gas mains along Plant and Adler Streets was approved. After the design was completed and the project bid, the price came in higher than was estimated. The original agreement required the City to pay for any oversizing. With this new agreement, Kendall County will be reimbursing the City for half of the oversizing cost because the County's Law Enforcement Center required gas flow has increased. Staff recommended approval of the agreement.

The total number of projects exceeded the dollar amount budgeted. The City's project submitted for improvements to Cascade Caverns Road did not get approved. Although participation from Kendall County residents was high, most of the comments were negative as they thought the discussion was for the Kendall Gateway Project.
