Mayor Schultz called the City Council meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

(ProCore Developments, one of one hearing)

Mayor Schultz opened the Public Hearing at 6:05 p.m.

Renita Reavis, 117 Green Meadows spoke against the proposed rezoning of 12 Herff Road. She stated that she bought her home on Green Meadows eight years ago. She would not have bought the home if she knew a business would be built next door. She felt that businesses don't belong in the area of her neighborhood. There are 15 houses on her street, most of the residents are retired. She expressed concerns with traffic and noise.

Andy Friedman - 16331 Dexter Point, Cypress, TX spoke on behalf of he and his partner who are the developers of 12 Herff Road. He stated their vision for the property is for a boutique type development. He stated that the City's Overlay District addresses many of the concerns.

Mayor Schultz closed the Public Hearing at 6:18 p.m.

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Laura Talley, Planning and Community Development Director. Ms. Talley displayed a map of the property located at 12 Herff Road under consideration for rezoning. She also displayed the City's zoning map indicating the current zoning of the property as well as other properties in the area. Ms. Talley discussed the restrictions that would be associated with the property per the North Herff Road Overlay District if the property was rezoned. Ms. Talley stated that the Developer has committed to saving trees and working towards deed restrictions. Staff feels commercial

development is imminent since Herff Road was extended. The Planning and Zoning Commission voted 4-3 in support of the rezoning. Staff also supports the proposed rezoning. Discussion ensued regarding MU-1 and B-2 zoning districts, confusion with the term Highway Commercial District, and the zoning districts which allow drive-thrus. Discussion ensued regarding the rezoning process if the request was denied by the City Council or if the developers of the property decided to not move forward with the request.

Mayor Schultz presented Assistant City Manager Linda Zartler, Deputy City Manager Siria Arreola, and City Secretary Lori Carroll with a proclamation declaring May 6, 2018 through May 12, 2018 as Texas Municipal Clerks Week.

8. [2018-356](#) RECEIVE THE SECOND QUARTER FINANCIAL AND INVESTMENT REPORTS FOR FY 2017/ 2018.

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Sandy Mattick, Finance Director to present the Quarterly Financial and Investment Report for the six months ending March 31,

2018. Ms. Mattick stated that in the General Fund, revenues before transfers were above projection at 59.33% and expenditures were below projections at 43.32%. Sales tax collections were up 5.50% and Ad Valorem tax collections were at 97.64%. In the Electric Fund, revenues were at 51.93% of budget and expenses were below projections at 41.99%. In the Water Fund, revenues were at 50.33% of budget and expenses were below projections at 46.08%. In the Wastewater Fund, revenues were at 50.44% of budget and expenses were above projections at 56.23%. In the Gas Fund, revenues were at 54.14% of budget and expenses were below projections at 47.57%. Ms. Mattick continued with a review of the Second Quarter Investment Activity. She stated that the City invested in TexPool, MBIA, Texas TERM, TexStar, Government Agencies, municipal bonds, commercial paper, treasury notes and several Certificates of Deposit. Interest earned for the quarter totaled \$256,803. Staff will continue to monitor interest rate activity and act accordingly.
