Mr. Thompson explained that the City entered into an agreement with Calder and his wife's estate in 2009 to secure green space and right-of-way for The property has since become a part of a drainage facility on the property. the SoBo development. Franklin Park Senior Living Facility has since constructed and some of the proposed drainage features were built by that developer. The original drainage facility was to be above ground, water from extreme rain events approximately from Second Bandera Road to a release point on Menger Creek. The cost then for the above ground facility was approximately \$350,000. After the property changed hands Calder to the current owner Bill Walters, Mr. Walter's preference underground alter the original plan from above ground to at \$700,000. City Staff is proposing that the City pay 48% of the actual project cost up to a maximum of \$347,080. The City would not amend the original letter agreement for cost sharing. but simply enter into a 2009 agreement, The source of funds would come from Economic Development funds. Ms. Mattick continued with a discussion on the proposed budget. She stated the final Public Hearing for the tax rate will be held on August 28, 2018 and the budget will be on the September 11, 2018 agenda for the City Council's consideration.

Deputy City Manager Jeff Thompson discussed Alternative Funding Sources. been hired to Kimlev-Horn has provide recommendations to the City's Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) ordinance. He stated some cities have implemented fees residential Roadway from and commercial accounts to apply to Fees. The City would need to prepare a comprehensive roadway improvement assessment and plan to identify priorities and estimate costs. In regards to Street Impact Fees, a fee similar to Water and Wastewater impact fees, would include specific calculation and collection criteria and uses for the funds. fee can only be colelcted for development within the city limits. The City has hired Kimley-Horn research and make recommendations to establishing a Stormwater Utility. Fees would be collected from all customers and would be used for drainage and stormwater mitigation projects. The study will be ready by the end of the calendar year. Community Services Director Danny Zincke spoke on the Parkland Dedication ordinance. Staff has surveyed other cities and has developed a template for proposed updates to dedications and fees. City Manager Ron Bowman stated that City Council could choose to do these options or move forward with а bond issue. Discussion ensued regarding Roadway Maintenance Fees not being a good option, including existing properties and redevelopments in Proportionality.

Mr. Thompson continued with а discussion on Sidewalks. He stated an additional \$150,000 from General Fund will be used to complete the Pedestrian Bentwood Drive, sidewalks Bridge at on West San Antonio, and oversizing sidewalk on Herff Road.

Mr. Thompson continued with LED Street Light Conversion. The options to convert the current High Pressure Sodium street to He stated \$80,000 is currently in the budget for this project. If LED luminaires. a full change out option is selected, an additional \$40,000 will be added to the budget to complete the project in two years.

that Mr. Thompson noted after the Master Plan is adopted, additional \$100,000 for Consulting Fees will be needed to update the Subdivision Ordinance, the Zoning Ordinance, and the Master Thoroughfare Plan.

Ms. Mattick continued with the City of Boerne Tax Rate Comparisons. She reviewed the property tax rate history for the City of Boerne, reminding City Council that the voters in 2007 approved a six cent increase. The City has only increased the tax rate two cents in 15 years. She presented a comparison cities similar in populations, similar total net taxable values, utility. cities that own their own electric Discussion ensued regarding growing community and having a large sales tax base, Boerne is doing things larger cities are doing, the option of raising property taxes, and the unknown of what the legislature will do.

Ms. Mattick reviewed the project costs for the Convention and Visitors Bureau Visitors Center and the funding sources. Discussion ensued regarding how the Hotel/Motel tax can be used, putting money back into the General Fund, and effects on the bond rating.

Utilities Director Mike Mann discussed the electric re-conductoring Boerne Electric Department did in 2005-2016. The re-conductoring project in FY 2017 was \$600,000. To complete the project, the current estimate \$900,000. Staff is proposing splitting the project over two years with \$450,000 in FY 2019 to be funded by the Electric Utility Capital Reserve. of the proposed area was displayed.

The discussion continued with the Wastewater Utility Fund. Guadalupe Blanco River Authority (GBRA) has requested that the City of Boerne and Fair Oaks Ranch participate in a Regional Wastewater Study. The City of Boerne's portion of the study will be \$15,000.

As previously discussed, the City of Boerne is considering entering into a cost а agreement with New Braunels and Fredericksburg for legislative consultant during the next legislative session in Austin. The estimated cost to the City of Boerne is \$33,000. Discussion ensued on who would be hiring the consultant, the City Attorney will be asking for a recommendation from Texas Municipal League, and the agreement will go before each entitv consideration.

Ms. Mattick discussed the projected fund balances in General Government and

Utility Funds. Mr. Bowman reminded the City Council that this budget is not concrete and can be adjusted as needed during the year.
