Staff is currently reviewing the bid. lt is Staff's that Resolution No. 2018-R76 be recommendation approved without the company's name, but to include the amount not to exceed \$21,500. It is hoped that the cost will be less than the initial bid.

Woolard called on Ms. Pro Tem Kirsten Cohoon, City Attorney. Ms. Cohoon reminded the City Council that in 2017, the City of Boerne created its first Legislative Plan which allowed Staff to act swiftly to proposed legislation affect the City. She presented highlights of the 2017 Legislation Session which included more than 6,000 Bills filed with over 2,000 of those Bills affecting cities, over 1,200 were signed into law, and 300 of impacted cities way. She discussed the timeline for the 86th in some Legislative Session dates. Ms. Cohoon reviewed the proposed City's 2019 Plan. She asked the City Council Members to contact with Legislative her possible in hopes that the Plan be approved before the feedback as soon as end of the year, before the Session begins. Discussion ensued regarding Texas League and the part they play during the Legislative Session. Manager Ron Bowman stated that a new Speaker of the House will need to be elected to replace Joe Strauss.

Mayor Pro Tem Woolard called on Mr. Mike Mann, Utilities Director. Mr. Mann explained that Staff received an email from TxDOT wanting to implement a new speed limit on Esser Rd (HWY 474). This request requires the City of Boerne to pass an ordinance establishing the maximum speed limit from 40 miles per hour to 35 miles per hour between Chaparral Creek Drive to Adler Street. TxDot will install the signage. Staff is in support of the modification.
