SUMMARY	On April 9 th , Council approved on first reading the Stormwater Utility Drainage Ordinance. This is the final step in the process after the public hearing on the ordinance, the second reading of the ordinance, and the public hearing on the establishment and calculation of charges (tiers/rates) and credits which will all take place at this meeting. Even though the tiers/rates are part of the ordinance, they must be adopted separately. As discussed, the start date for billing Stormwater Utility fees remains January 1, 2020, and the School District, County facilities and religious institutions will be phased in at 50% of the full rate for 2020 before implementing the full rate in January of 2021. Staff has begun researching stormwater utility rate credits offered in other cities to include San Antonio, New Braunfels and San Marcos in our region. The results of the research and potential stormwater utility credits and other water conservation-based rebates will be presented to City Council for consideration no later than the Fall of 2019.
