<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	CONSIDER RESOLUTION NO. 2019-R129; A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AND MANAGE AN AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BOERNE AND TROY DORMAN OF HALFF ASSOCIATES, INC. FOR REVISIONS TO CITY ORDINANCES RELATING TO STORMWATER RUNOFF AND LOW IMPACT DEVELOPMENT.
<b>STAFF'S RECOMMENDED ACTION (be specific)</b>	Approve Resolution No. 2019-R129; Authorizing an amendment to the agreement with Troy Dorman with Halff Associates, Inc. for revisions to city ordinances relating to stormwater runoff and low impact development in an amount not to exceed \$67,299.00.

<b>SUMMARY</b>	<p>At the July 9<sup>th</sup> meeting Council gave direction that Staff hire a consultant to assist in revisions to our current and proposed ordinances regarding Stormwater runoff/low impact development (LID) to address water <u>quality</u> related to runoff. Then on July 23<sup>rd</sup>, Council authorized the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Troy Dorman of Halff Associates, Inc. The initial contract updating current and proposed ordinances regarding incorporation or enhancement of stormwater/LID regulations targeted toward water quality was in the amount of \$49,561.</p> <p>Staff also currently has an initiative to coordinate uniformity and consistency between Kendall County and City regulations for stormwater/detention. These are water <u>quantity</u> issues related to runoff. Staff has met with Councilmember Wolosin, the County Engineers and Commissioner Richard Chapman to discuss how best to achieve this goal.</p> <p>After some discussion with the group regarding the differences in regulations, it was decided that coordination between the City and County is advantageous for both entities. Councilmember Wolosin requested that we consider this update with our LID ordinance updates. Mr. Tobolka, the County Engineer offered a financial commitment of \$10,000 to assist with consulting services. We've asked Mr. Troy Dorman of Halff Associates to provide a revised scope of services that would include an update to the stormwater detention sections of the ordinance and coordinate with the County regarding</p>

	<p>the update to their rules as well.</p> <p>The revised scope of services includes an amount of \$17,738 to cover the additional services. Staff is asking Council for approval for the City Manager to enter into a contract with Troy Dorman of Halff Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$67,299.</p>
