SUMMARY	In September of 2015, the City entered into a Regional Utility Agreement with Kendall West Utilities (KWU) for the provision of water and sewer service outside the City limits. In August 2016, changes were made to the Agreement whereby KWU could serve in the City's designated service area and vice versa with prior approval from the other utility (i.e., Durango Subdivision on Shooting Club Road). KWU has begun serving end use water customers in the Shooting Club
	Road area and an Ordinance clearly spelling out the obligations is necessary for collection of franchise fees. A slight revision to the Agreement is also necessary. KWU service in the City limits is similar to Bandera or Pedernales Electric Cooperatives service and should be subject to a 4% City of Boerne Franchise Fee.
