Mr. Bowman was excited to announce that the City of Boerne, for the 32nd consecutive year, has been awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR). Ms. Sandy Mattick, Director expressed appreciation Finance Staff for the **Finance** to compiling of the CAFR.

Mayor Handren called Ms. Sandy Mattick, on Finance Director. Ms. Mattick provided the Quarterly Financial Report and reported that the City is strong financial position. Revenues (excluding budgeted fund balance) were at 37.28% of budget, expenditures were below projections at 22.50%, sales tax collections were up 9.69% from this period last year, and ad valorem collections were at 82.66%. The electric revenues were at 21.88% of budget and the expenses were at 22.00% of budget. The water revenues were at 26.32% of expenses were 19.90% of budget. The wastewater revenues budget and at were at 25.06% of budget and expenses were at 23.83% of budget. The gas revenues were at 21.91% of budget and expenses were at 22.10% of budget. Mattick continued with the Quarterly Investment Report. The Public Funds that written investment transactions for all Investment Act requires funds submitted the governing bodv at least quarterly. The Citv of Boerne to Government invested TexPool. MBIA, Texas TERM, TexStar, in Agencies, bonds, commercial paper, and Certificates of Deposit (CD's). Interest reporting quarter totaled \$349,932. Handren called Mr. Mike Mann, Utilities Director. Mayor on Mr. Mann explained that a few weeks ago the City Council rejected bids for work to both wastewater treatment plants due to cost. Staff has found a remedy to the Ultraviolate Replacement portion of the initial bid at the Esser Road plant, so it was removed from the project. The project was re-bid to include installation of the sludge handling facilities beneath the clarifiers. Four piping in bids were received. The City's consultant engineer reviewed the low bidder's recommended awarding qualifications and the bid to Associated Construction Partners, LTD from Boerne.
