SUMMARY	<p>Wildland / Urban Interface (WUI) fires are a growing concern as structures and human development meet and intermingle with undeveloped Wildland or vegetative fuels. A proactive action to correct this concern is to develop a Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP). The first step in this process is announcing to the public the intent to pursue the creation of the CWPP by approving a Resolution supporting the development of the plan.</p> <p>The Community Wildfire Protection Plan will focus on local codes and ordinances, home ignition zones, defensible space, ignition resistant construction and design standards, as well as hazardous fuel reduction in parks, common owned areas and open spaces within the City of Boerne and surrounding areas. We will work jointly with the Texas Forest Service, homeowner associations, County and City departments and other agencies to identify risks of wildfire, put forth suggestions for mitigation and provide awareness of wildfire risks.</p>
