| Background Information | When the last contractual amendment for Mosaic was approved by City Council in April, staff stated our belief that the cost adjustment for the UDC project would be sufficient to finish the project. There have been, however, some unforeseen project needs that have arisen. The last amendment was proposed to cover technical advisory services, outreach, mapping and additional meetings/ presentations. Just prior to the approval of the contract amount the Planning and Zoning Commission established a subcommittee to help with public outreach. The subcommittee requested that staff put together materials that would help clarify for the public the zoning and overlay districts. These "At-A-Glance" sheets turned out to be very beneficial and made it much easier for the public to understand how they would be affected by the zoning changes. The documents are very detailed and ended up taking a lot of Mosaic's time and technical expertise to put together. As has been previously stated, there were over 20 subcommittee meetings and staff hired a temporary employee, who Carissa worked directly with, to accommodate getting the At-A-Glance sheets completed. While the sheets were a good idea and will be extremely beneficial in helping people understand the new rules, the majority of the money set aside to work on the handbook was used to create these documents. The handbook, including these graphical sheets, will be instrumental in making the text document user friendly; one of the goals in the | |
