Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Jeff Thompson, Deputy City Manager. Mr. Thompson displayed a map of the property location. He stated that the developer plans to subdivide the 40.892 acres located off of Shooting Club Road across from the North Industrial Park into approximately 100 home sites. The Planning and Zoning Commission voted 5-0 in favor of the permanent zoning of RN-1, Neighborhood Residential District. Mr. Thompson discussed the topography of the property and how it is too extreme for industrial development. City of Boerne will provide the utilities with the exception of water service which will be provided by Kendall West Utility and Bandera Electric Cooperative will provide the electric service.

Mr. Thompson continued with the proposed rezoning of 502 School Street. A map was displayed of the location. Mr. Thompson stated that a Memory Care Facility was planned for the property. The property owner originally requested the property be rezoned B-2R, Highway Commercial Restricted District, but the Planning and Zoning Commission voted in favor of a B-1, High-Density Residential and Neighborhood Commercial District which is more restrictive. A B-1 zoning will require City Council's approval for a use of a long term care

facility for memory care. Discussion ensued regarding requirements of the developer relating to road widening, curbing, sidewalks, and dedicated right of way.

Ms. Mattick continued with the Fourth Quarter Financial Report. She stated that revenues before transfers were above projection at 107.79%. Expenditures were below projections at 91.76%, sales tax collections were up 12.35% and ad valorem tax collections were at 98.89%. For the Utility Funds: Electric revenues were at 102.2% of budget and expenditures were below projections at 98.09%; Water revenues were at 108.11% of budget and expenditures were below projections at 99.21%; Wastewater revenues were at 107.48% of budget and expenditures were below projections at 92.94%; Gas revenues were at 88.41% of budget and expenditures were below projections at 86.78%. Ms. Mattick reviewed the Fourth Quarter Investment Report stating that the City of Boerne invested in TexPool, MBIA, Texas TERM, TexStar, Government Agencies, a municipal bond, commercial paper, and several Certificates of Deposit. Interest earned for this quarter totaled \$66,108. Mayor Schultz expressed his appreciate to Staff for a job well done.

asking the City Council to authorize the City Manager to enter into and manage an agreement with Burditt Land-Place Consultants not to exceed \$96,500. It is anticipated that in November or December Staff will likely return to City Council to amend the contract to include additional options and ordinance updates. The total budget for this project is \$150,000. Mr. Thompson introduced Mr. Shane Howard with Burditt Land-Place Consultants in the audience. Mr. Howard stated that Boerne is experiencing significant growth and has a dynamic group of people and looks forward to working with City Staff on the Master Plan update. Discussion ensued regarding public involvement and input.

Mr. Thompson stated the Staff has received an annexation request for two properties located within the Southglen Subdivision on Cascade Caverns Road. He stated that these properties were not included in the initial annexation of Southglen due to the size restrictions governed by the Texas Local Government

Code. An annexation cannot exceed more than one mile in width. He displayed a map of the location. As a requirement of the annexation process, the City Council at this time needs to set the date and time for two public hearings.
