and online survey that brought over 1,700 responses. There were three open houses and two joint meetings (Master Plan Steering Committee, City and Planning and Zoning Commission). Council. City Staff is currently editing and will provide City Council one chapter time. The at а community will also have an opportunity to add additional comments. Ms. Talley reminded the City Council that this is a document of guidance. Staff will annually and make adjustments every five years. Discussion ensued individuals regarding the number of responses from outside the City, expansion of our gateways with the growth of the City, funding and challenges related to the Parks Master Plan, drainage and the impact on developments. Ms. Tallev stated that the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) is in the process of being updated to coinside with the Federal (FEMA). City Bowman stated Emergency Management Agency Manager Ron that there are always challenges when going through the budget process with funding for items in the Master Plan. The City Council and Staff will continue to make decisions that don't over burden the taxpayers. More can be achieved if the City has willing partners. Staff will schedule meetings with the City Council to review the Master Plan document.

On May 9, 2018 with a 30 day notice that the natural gas West Texas Gas contacted City Staff transmission line that serves both the City's substations will experience of up 18 days for mandatory maintenance of planned outage to the pipeline regulatory reasons. Grey Forest Utilities was contacted and thev back-feed Boerne's entire system. likely that they can lt is would see no interruption of service. However, Staff feels a back-up plan needs Staff's recommendation to contract with be in place. lt is Center Energy for use of a mobile compressed natural gas tanker.
