FORFEITURE PROVISIONS, AND QUALIFICATIONS OF THE DISTRICT
1 ELECTED OFFICIAL.**

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Kirsten Cohoon, City Attorney. Ms. Cohoon briefed the City Council Members on the history and notification by Council Member Joe Anzollitto to move his homestead from District 1 to District 2 and did not have an intention to return to District 1. Council Member Anzollitto informed Ms. Cohoon that he will be renting a room from the home of a friend in District 1 in an attempt to maintain residency requirements as per the City of Boerne Home Rule Charter, but will be spending his time at the new District 2 address. His furniture and clothing will be at the District 2 address and he will be spending his time and sleeping at the District 2 address. Ms. Cohoon reviewed the qualifications as stated in the Home Rule Charter. It is the opinion of outside counsel and the City Attorney's office, that these factors establish residency at the new address which is outside District 1. Discussion ensued regarding calling for a Special Election to fill the vacancy. Ms. Cohoon stated that the Home Rule Charter 3.08 states that there cannot be two appointed qualified persons on the City Council without having an election. To fill one vacancy, the City Council will appoint a qualified person within 30 days of the vacancy who will serve the remainder of the term, until May 2020. Discussion also ensued regarding abiding by and interpreting the Home Rule Charter written in the 1990's and that the decision isn't about Council Member Anzollitto personally.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCIL MEMBER CISNEROS, SECONDED BY MAYOR PRO TEM WOOLARD, TO APPROVE MOTION FINDING THAT AS OF NOVEMBER 13, 2018, THE COUNCIL MEMBER FOR DISTRICT 1 HAS CEASED BEING A RESIDENT OF DISTRICT 1 WHICH IS A REQUIRED QUALIFICATION UNDER SECTION 3.03 OF THE BOERNE HOME RULE CHARTER AND AS THE FINAL JUDGE OF ALL QUALIFICATIONS OF ITS MEMBERS UNDER SECTION 3.04 OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER, THE CITY COUNCIL HEREBY DECLARES THAT COUNCIL MEMBER FOR DISTRICT 1 HAS FORFEITED HIS SEAT AS A COUNCIL MEMBER FOR DISTRICT 1 UNDER SECTION 3.08 OF THE HOME RULE CHARTER. THE MOTION CARRIED BY THE FOLLOWING VOTE:

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Sandy Mattick, Finance Director. She reviewed the proposed budget amendments for fiscal year 2017-2018 budget. The adjustments include the General Fund: \$115,169 for expenditures related to the Convention and Visitors Bureau building; \$1,350,000 to record the transfer to establish the Capital Projects Construction Fund; \$10,850 for the Animal Shelter and facility improvement expenditures; Park Fund: \$1,400,000 for TxDOT grant projects; Library Fund: \$72,150 revenues and expenditures related to salaries and operations of the Library; Economic Development: \$484,000 for payments made during fiscal year 2018; Capital Projects Fund: \$1,350,254 to record transfer establishing fund; Electric Fund: \$1,555,000 for trail grant expenditures; and Water Fund: \$90,000 to increase budget for water sales and additional operating expenditures. Staff recommended approval of Ordinance No. 2018-41.

Ms. Mattick continued with the Fourth Quarter Financial Report for FY 2017-2018. She stated that the budget amendments for FY 2017-2018 were considered when creating the financial report. The revenues (excluding budgeted and fund balance) were above projection at 100.92% and

expenditures were below projections at 92.50%. Sales Tax collections were up 5.73% from this period last year. Ad valorem tax collections were at 99.27%. Electric revenues were at 100.55% of budget and expenses were below projections at 98.61%; Water revenues were at 110.50% of budget and expenses were below projections at 95.21%; Wastewater revenues were at 102.65% of budget and expenses were below projections at 98.61%; and Gas revenues were at 92.67% of budget and expenses were below projections at 99.41%. Ms. Mattick reported on Tax Collection of \$7,711,247.17 which is the first time it has reached over \$7,000,000.00. Ms. Mattick continued with the Quarterly Investment Report. The Public Funds Act requires that a written report be provided to the governing body at least quarterly. During the quarter, the City of Boerne invested in TexPool, MBIA, Texas TERM, TexStar, Government Agencies, municipal bonds, commercial paper, treasury notes and several Certificates of Deposit (CD's). Interest earned for the quarter totaled \$335,765.00. Staff will continue to monitor interest rate activity and act accordingly when opportunities arise.

Ms. Mattick continued with modifications to the City's Fee Ordinance. She stated that Department Heads were consulted and were given the opportunity to review the Fee Ordinance and make any suggestions for changes. Ms.

Mattick reviewed the proposed changes. Discussion ensued regarding the reduced scanning fees at the library and the reduced re-zoning application fee. Concerns were expressed regarding the new fee established for the Historic Landmark Commission Processing Fee and the Drip Irrigation Fee.

Mayor Schultz noted this is the 31st consecutive year that the City of Boerne has received the award.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Mike Mann, Utilities Director. Mr. Mann displayed

a map of the area of Cascade Caverns Road, Ranch Drive, and Southglen Parkway. He stated that traffic control devices were erected and maintained by Kendall County prior to the annexation. Staff has been watching traffic patterns in the area and feels it necessary to add an additional stop sign, causing a four-way stop, due to increased traffic and to improve traffic safety.

Mr. Mann continued with the proposed amendment to the Boerne Utilities Rules and Regulations. Over the past few years, private water supply wells have been drilled within the City limits. Some of the installations have occurred where the City has or has the physical and/or regulatory ability to install public water services to the property from our distribution system. It is Staff's recommendation that language be added to the City of Boerne Utilities Rules and Regulations to require an application directed to the Mayor which will be presented to the City Council for consideration before a well will be permitted to be drilled in the City limits.

Mr. Mann continued with a photo of a Magna Drive pump assembly that was installed approximately 14 years ago at the Buckskin Water Tank Site, which is the GBRA water delivery point. This pump allows the City to alter the flow rates on discharge at the site. The Magna Drive is in need of a complete rebuild due to bearing failure. Because this equipment is vital, Staff recommended approval of the expenditure.
