1. CALL TO ORDER – 4:30 PM

Mayor Schultz called the City Council to order at 4:30 p.m.

2. [2019-252](#) DISCUSSION ON STORMWATER UTILITY

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Jeff Thompson, Deputy City Manager to discuss the creation of a new Stormwater Utility that the City Council gave the go-ahead last summer. Staff along with consultants Steve Galloway from Kimley Horn and Matthew Garrett from Newgen Strategies have been working to refine the impervious cover data which will be used for billing and identifying the costs associated with stormwater operations, as well as the capital projects that were identified in 2017, which staff believes addresses some of the worst drainage issues. It was determined that an average residential impervious surface is 4,700 sf. Mr. Galloway provided a definition of Stormwater Utility and reviewed a list of what the funds from the utility can be used for. He stated that if the City chooses, properties owned by the city, the school, the county, and churches can be exempted from the stormwater utility fee. It is

staff's recommendation that the these entities not be exempt, but allow a phase-in with the exception of the city. The City will be fully billed at the time of implementation. Mr. Galloway discussed the timeline and the process for establishing the Stormwater Utility Fee. Mr. Thompson stated that the impact on an average residential customer is \$4.00 per month. Discussion ensued regarding the Equivalent Residential Units (ERU) varies per city; reason for drainage issues; incentivizing or providing a credit to those businesses enacting LID and for residential customers who install rainwater catchment. Mr. Garrett stated that any type of catchment systems incentives should be included in the water utility not the stormwater utility. Discussion continued with surveying other cities who have implemented the utility to see what they would do differently; using utility revenues for TxDOT projects in the City; considering duplexes as commercial property; and using a Certificate of Obligation to pay for these projects.

Mayor Schultz called the City Council to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Schultz asked for a Moment of Silence and led the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag and to the Texas Flag.

2. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

No conflicts were declared.

3. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Joe Anzollitto, 102 Dry Creek spoke on the Stormwater Utility. He stated that he feels the new utility is a great idea and he is glad the city is moving forward. He suggested that the City Council table the item until the Unified Development Code is complete. He read excerpts from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) report. He stated that six of the top 12 projects listed in the report from the workshop, are government owned facilities which doesn't show a good example.

JJ Blackson, 220 Shadywood spoke on the proposed rezoning of 1025 E. Blanco Road. She stated that she does not want 28 houses behind her home. She expressed a concern with drainage.

Bonnie Clanin, 108 Lone Star stated that the City Council should take into

consideration the people affected by rezoning property.

Peggy Brimhall, representative of Figurd who is the developer of 1025 E. Blanco Road. She dispersed information to the City Council regarding the proposed development which includes 28 units: 11 singles, 2 duplexes, and 3 triplexes. The project includes a community lawn and garden and social area with a stormwater management area.

City Staff is proposing a \$4.00 Equivalent Residential Units (ERU) to be implemented in January. Staff also recommends delaying the fee charged to properties owned by the county, BISD, and churches for one year. The revenues from the utility would help complete a drainage study for the entire city. He reviewed the timeline required for implementing the new Stormwater Utility fee.

He stated that the extension of the property is to construct 29 cottages on the property and will be contiguous to the current Morningside campus. Ms. Talley continued with the rezoning of the property located at 1025 East Blanco Road. She displayed a map of the property location as well as a zoning map for the area. Ms. Talley stated that the property owner has requested the 2.992 acres be rezoned from O, Office District and R-1, Medium-Density Single Family Residential District to R-3, High Density Residential District. The developer has provided a draft site plan, but also is considering a Planned Unit Development. The plan has not yet been approved by the City as it does require further detailed review through the platting process. Ms. Talley stated that the required notifications were sent to property owners within 200' of the property. Three responses indicated in favor of the development and one response was in opposition. The Planning and Zoning Commission voted 6-1 in favor of the rezoning and staff is also supportive of the rezoning as requested. Discussion ensued regarding drainage. Ms. Talley stated that drainage will be addressed during the platting process. This area is identified on the Future Land Use map as "Transitional Residential". This is a higher-density residential use that allows this type of development that transitions between commercial and lower density residential areas. The proposed R-3 district is both appropriate for the location and fills the communities desire for walkable infill development in Boerne. The Planning and Zoning Commission voted 6-1 in favor of the proposed rezoning and Staff is also supportive of the request. Discussion continued regarding the platting process, concerns with density, and traffic.

Mayor Schultz called on Ms. Sandy Mattick, Finance Director. Ms. Mattick introduced Duane and Nick Westerman of SAMCO Capital Markets, Inc. Duane explained debt issuance limitations and types of debt issuance. Ms. Mattick discussed Municipal Lease option for short term financing. Mr. Westerman continued with the discussion on debt issuance noting that all debt issuance must be approved by the Attorney General. He reviewed the city's debt and analysis for refunding and the outstanding debt issues for the city. Mr. Westerman presented a scenario to refund the GO Refunding Bonds, Series 2011 and realize a potential net present value of savings of \$88,310. These bonds were a reissue of previous debt for street improvements and extensions, purchase of a fire truck and purchase of the city campus land. The reissued debt will be for the balance of the current debt and paid off within the same terms of the bonds being refunded. Mr. Westerman stated that the agenda item tonight is for the City Council to consider authorization and issuance of General Obligation Refunding Bonds for the purpose of achieving debt service savings. The terms for the refunding: principal amount of Refunding issue not to exceed \$2,720,000; maximum maturity will be March 1, 2027; the true interest cost on the issue will not exceed 4%; the savings will be a minimum of 2.5% net present value savings. Discussion ensued regarding the fee structure associated with the refunding. Mr. Westerman estimated the cost to be approximately \$30,000 to \$35,000.

After multiple discussions during city council meetings, staff has determined a priority list of properties to be annexed. She discussed the criteria used for ranking the properties. It will take a few years to complete the annexations as presented. Ms. Talley stated she anticipates the Annexation Strategy will be brought to City Council annually for updates. Discussion ensued regarding changing the priority list, moving more quickly on the annexation process, and protecting the City's entrance corridor. There was also discussion on development agreements for those properties with Ag exemptions.

Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Jeff Thompson to discuss the proposed speed limit on Herff Road from River Road to Main Street. Mr. Thompson stated at the last City Council meeting, there was mention of conducting a speed study to measure how safe drivers feel in a stretch of roadway. Since that meeting, Staff measured the speed for a week in four locations. The 85th percentile were between 39.9 and 43.5 mph. The average speeds were between 35.6 and 38.02 mph. Based on the geometry of the roadway as designed/constructed, Staff's recommendation is that the speed limit be set to 35 mph in the interest of long-term safety. This speed would be consistent with other City streets with the exception of Main Street.
