A tall truck coming out of the new Jaguar Dealership hit a wire tripping a breaker at the substation. The electricity was down for a short period of time.

Mattick. Finance Director provided an update on the sale the bonds. She stated that bids were received this morning. Ιt was intially projected that the City could potentially receive a savings of \$103,000, but actually the City will receive \$119,000 savings with Broadway Bank.

Jeff Thompson. Deputy City Manager provided an update on the widening on Blanco Road. There is a portion of the sidewalk that is near a tree and staff is working to aviod damaging the tree. The City was waiting on TxDOT Mr. Thompson also provided an update on the River to approve the design. anticipates beginning the project mid-May and Road crosswalk. TxDOT be completed mid-July.

Mike Mann, Public Works Director updated the City Council on the Bentwood Drive Sidewalk. The culvert extension should be completed in five or six weeks.
