Ms. Mattick continued with the Fourth Quarter Financial and Investment Reports for Fiscal Year 2019. She stated that the Revenues excluding budgeted 102.50%. balance were above projection at Expenditures were below Sales tax collections were up 12.48% from this projections at 91.42%. period Ad valorem tax collections were at 99.40% of the levy. The Electric 100.84% of budget and expenses were below projections at revenues were at 86.77%. Water revenues were at 115.45% of budget and expenses were below projections at 97.27%. Wastewater revenues were at 103.56% of budget and expenses were below projections at 89.94%. Gas revenues were at 105.90% of budget and expenses were below projections at 94.71%. Ms. Mattick stated that the Public Funds Investment Act requires a written report to the governing body for all funds. During this quarter, the City of Boerne invested in TexPool, TERM, TexStar, Government MBIA, Texas Agencies municipal bonds, and Certificates of Deposit (CD's). commercial paper, Interest earned for this quarter totaled \$390,008. Staff will continue to monitor interest rate activity and act accordingly when opportunities arise.
