Mayor Handren called on City Manager Ron Bowman. Mr. Bowman was excited to announce that the City of Boerne, for the 32nd consecutive year, has been awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR). Ms. Sandy Mattick, Finance Director expressed appreciation to Finance Staff for the compiling of the CAFR.

6. [2020-170](#) RECEIVE THE FIRST QUARTER FINANCIAL AND INVESTMENT REPORTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020.

Mayor Handren called on Ms. Sandy Mattick, Finance Director. Ms. Mattick provided the Quarterly Financial Report and reported that the City is in a strong financial position. Revenues (excluding budgeted fund balance) were at 37.28% of budget, expenditures were below projections at 22.50%, sales tax collections were up 9.69% from this period last year, and ad valorem tax collections were at 82.66%. The electric revenues were at 21.88% of budget and the expenses were at 22.00% of budget. The water revenues were at 26.32% of budget and expenses were at 19.90% of budget. The wastewater revenues were at 25.06% of budget and expenses were at 23.83% of budget. The gas revenues were at 21.91% of budget and expenses were at 22.10% of budget. Ms. Mattick continued with the Quarterly Investment Report. The Public Funds Investment Act requires that written investment transactions for all funds be submitted to the governing body at least quarterly. The City of Boerne invested in TexPool, MBIA, Texas TERM, TexStar, Government Agencies, municipal bonds, commercial paper, and Certificates of Deposit (CD's). Interest earned for this reporting quarter totaled \$349,932. Ms. Mattick stated that staff will continue to monitor interest rate activity and act accordingly when opportunities arise.

Mayor Handren called on Ms. Laura Talley, Planning and Community Development Director. Ms. Talley displayed a map of the property located at 87 Market Avenue. Ms. Talley reminded the City Council that the vote on the first reading of the ordinance to rezone the property was not unanimous. The property owner is requesting the property be rezoned from from I, Industrial District to B-2R, Highway Commercial Restricted District.

Ms. Talley continued with discussion on the proposed modifications to the Subdivision Ordinance. With the assistance of the City's consultant, Troy Dorman the ordinance will include further detail regarding Low Impact Development (LID) and stormwater, which will now also apply to the ETJ. Ms. Talley spoke to changes in zones, drainage, and flood hazards, replacing terminology of Stream Corridor with Drainageway Protection Zone. She also discussed the proposed exemptions of Stormwater Management requirements. The modified ordinance does not allow any residential in a flood plain. Discussion ensued regarding the exemption of an individual lot if the owner is wanting to add patio or storage building which is 100 square feet. Mr. Dorman stated that it could be harmful to neighboring properties, causing

runoff from any new impervious cover into a vegetated area, especially if all neighbors added a patio or storage building. Enforcement could be an issue. City Manager Ron Bowman stated that we will take it a month at a time to see if additional staff is needed. Discussion also ensued regarding the Protection Zones, and if the ordinance is too progressive. Education is key to communication to the public.

Ms. Talley continued with the modifications in the Code of Ordinances regarding flood plains. She stated that new projects would be required to develop in accordance with the more accurate and up to date local floodplain, rather than solely using FEMA floodplain. With these proposed modifications, the City will no longer allow any development or disturbance in the floodway nor any increase in the base flood elevation. Discussion ensued regarding property owners altering flow by using fill and penalties set by state statute.

Mayor Handren called on Mr. Mike Mann, Utilities Director. Mr. Mann explained that a few weeks ago the City Council rejected bids for work to both wastewater treatment plants due to cost. Staff has found a remedy to the Ultraviolet Replacement portion of the initial bid at the Esser Road plant, so it was removed from the project. The project was re-bid to include installation of piping in the sludge handling facilities beneath the clarifiers. Four bids were received. The City's consultant engineer reviewed the low bidder's qualifications and recommended awarding the bid to Associated Construction Partners, LTD from Boerne.

Mr. Montagno stated that City Council approved the agreement with the Boerne Kendall County Economic Development Corporation (BKCEDC) contract in November of last year. Since that time, the University of Texas' IC2 Institute, has funded a grant through Planet Texas 2050 to partner with the BKCEDC and the City to create a 5-year Economic Development Strategic Plan. Ms. Amy Story, President and CEO of the BKCEDC explained the scope of work and the timeline of the project. It was Staff's recommendation to amend the agreement with BKCEDC to reflect the new Planet Texas 2050 timeline for completion of a strategic plan.

Mayor Handren called on Mr. Ron Bowman, City Manager to provide an update to the Dashboard Projects. Mr. Bowman stated out of the 98 projects listed, 43 have been completed. This will be the fifth year of the City's public art program. He distributed to the Council Members photos of the the top 10 pieces chosen. Mr. Bowman also updated the Council on TxDOT's project at the Visitor's Center. TxDOT has been unable to get in touch with the contractor. The Bevy was hosting the Winter Board meeting of Texas Association of Convention and Visitor's Association. It was well attended with vendors in the hallway. Ms. Linda Zartler, Assistant City Manager provided an update on the new City Hall. We are in the planning stage of an open house in March.
