Mr. John Young, applicant, shared how the property owner plans to develop this property. Mr. Young added there was an attempt to move and repurpose the structure, but it was not feasible.

Mr. Gary Bild, resident at 311 W. Theissen St, spoke again on the matter.

Ms. Sara Serra-Bennett mentioned that this property is zoned R2-M.

Ms. Laura Haning, Director of Planning and Community Development, clarified what uses are permitted within this zoning category. Ms. Haning also gave a detailed explanation of the rezoning process in the event that a property owner requests a use not permitted within a particular zoning.

Commissioner Justin Boerner shared his findings from the site visit. He did not see historical value in the structure.

Commissioner Sally Pena shared her findings from the site visit. She did not see historical value either.

Ms. Ann Shorter, St. Helena's Parish Administrator, believes whole sign will be resurfaced.
