MERITS AND COMPLAINTS

In an effort to ensure accountability within the department, we track all complaints. This includes origin as it relates to an internal or external complaint. In 2024, we documented 45 complaints, and 24 documented merits given to officers. In the handling of complaints, a supervisor will follow up with the complainant and exhaust all avenues to ensure our department maintains the level of professionalism our citizens and this community deserves. Of the 45 complaints, 15 were unfounded, and 15 were sustained and 15 were not sustained. Of the 45 complaints, 21 were external and 24 were internal complaints.


MENTAL HEALTH OFFICER

OFFICER FOLEY IS THE MENTAL HEALTH OFFICER (MHO) FOR THE BOERNE POLICE DEPARTMENT. SHE WORKS DIRECTLY WITH SUBJECTS ON CRISIS, DEESCALATES THE SITUATIONS, AND PROVIDES NECESSARY SERVICES TO SAFEGUARD THE SUBJECT'S HEALTH AND WELLBEING.

OFFICER FOLEY RESPONDS TO CRISIS CALLS FROM THE BOERNE POLICE DEPARTMENT, LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES, FAMILY SERVICE AGENCIES, LOCAL HOSPITALS, LOCAL CLINICS, AND FROM MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY, WHICH INVOLVE A POSSIBLE MENTALLY ILL PERSON. OFFICER FOLEY HAS 19 YEARS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT TO INCLUDE CERTIFICATIONS SUCH AS BASIC TCOLE INSTRUCTOR, SOUTHWEST TEXAS FUSION LIAISON OFFICER, TACTICAL MEDICINE OFFICER, TEXAS PARAMEDIC, CPR/AED INSTRUCTOR, BASIC HOSTAGE NEGOTIATOR, AND MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID INSTRUCTOR FOR FIRST RESPONDER AND THE COMMUNITY.

OFFICER FOLEY COMPLETED HER SECOND MASTER OF ARTS DEGREE IN CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH AND RECEIVED HER LICENSED PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR- ASSOCIATE (LPC-A) LICENSE.

IN 2024 WE WERE AWARDED A GRANT TO ESTABLISH AN ADDITIONAL MENTAL HEALTH OFFICER FOR 2025.







COMMUNITY POLICING

OFFICER CHRISTOPHER DINGMAN IS THE COMMUNITY POLICING AND EVENTS OFFICER FOR THE BOERNE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND IS IN CHARGE OF COORDINATING ALL SPECIAL EVENTS IN THE CITY. OFFICER DINGMAN ASSISTED WITH VARIOUS EVENT PERMITS IN COORDINATION WITH THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT. 2024 EVENTS CONSISTED OF COFFEE WITH A COP AT STARBUCKS AND BLACK RIFLE, TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE, SPECIAL OLYMPICS TIP A COP, FULL ESCORT OF BLL TO THE CITY.

OFFICER DINGMAN ATTENDS SEVERAL MEETINGS PER EVENT AND CONDUCTS MANY HOURS OF PLANNING AND SCHEDULING IN ORDER TO ENSURE EACH EVENT ARE SAFE. IN ADDITION TO SPECIAL EVENTS, OFFICER DINGMAN COORDINATES BUSINESS MEETINGS WITH BUSINESS OWNERS ACROSS THE CITY TO ENCOURAGE BETTER PRACTICES. THIS YEAR OFFICER DINGMAN OBTAINED HIS MASTERS OF ARTS IN LAW ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION FROM WAYLAND BASPTIST. OFFICER DINGMAN'S CERTIFICATIONS INCLUDE BASIC TCOLE INSTRUCTOR, FIELD TRAINING OFFICER, MENTAL HEALTH OFFICER, CHILD SEAT CERTIFIED TECHNICIAN, C.R.A.S.E INSTRUCTOR, AND BASIC BASIC NEGOTIATOR.











ANIMAL CONTROL

2024 END-OF-YEAR ANIMAL CONTROL STATEMENT

AS WE REFLECT ON 2024, WE ARE PROUD TO SHARE THE ACCOMPLISHMENTS, CHALLENGES, AND PROGRESS MADE BY OUR ANIMAL CONTROL DEPARTMENT. THIS YEAR HAS BEEN ONE OF GROWTH, RESILIENCE, AND DEDICATION TO THE WELL-BEING OF ANIMALS AND OUR COMMUNITY.

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- INCREASED ADOPTION RATES: WE FACILITATED THE ADOPTION OF OVER 454 ANIMALS LEADING TIO AN 18% ADOPTION RATE. LEADING TO THESE ANIMALS FINDING LOVING HOMES FOR DOGS, CATS, AND OTHER PETS IN NEFD
- SUCCESSFUL RESCUE OPERATIONS: OUR TEAM RESPONDED TO EMERGENCY CALLS, RESCUING ANIMALS FROM
 HAZARDOUS CONDITIONS AND ENSURING THEIR SAFETY.
- RABIES CLINIC INITIATIVES: THROUGH PARTNERSHIPS WITH LOCAL VETERINARIANS AT HILL COUNTRY ANIMAL LEAGUE WE WERE ABLE TO PROVIDE LOW COST RABIES VACCINES FOR THE PUBLIC.
- COMMUNITY OUTREACH: ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS HOSTED EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS AND EVENTS, PROMOTING RESPONSIBLE PET OWNERSHIP AND ANIMAL WELFARE AWARENESS.
- CHALLENGES FACED:

 OVERPOPULATION ISSUES: DESPITE OUR EFFORTS, THE HIGH INTAKE OF STRAY AND SURRENDERED ANIMALS REMAINED A SIGNIFICANT CHALLENGE.
- PUBLIC SAFETY CONCERNS: MANAGING AGGRESSIVE ANIMAL CASES REQUIRED INCREASED TRAINING.
 LOOKING AHEAD TO 2025:
- ENHANCED TRAINING PROGRAMS: FOCUSED ON IMPROVING STAFF SKILLS IN ANIMAL BEHAVIOR, RESCUE TECHNIQUES, AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT.
- FACILITY UPGRADES: PLANS TO MODERNIZE OUR SHELTER TO CREATE A MORE COMFORTABLE ENVIRONMENT FOR ANIMALS AND VISITORS.
- STRONGER COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS: EXPANDING COLLABORATIONS WITH RESCUE GROUPS, VOLUNTEERS, AND LOCAL BUSINESSES TO SUPPORT OUR MISSION.

HILL COUNTRY REGIONAL S.W.A.T

he Hill Country Regional S.W.A.T. team has achieved significant milestones in its first full year of operation. From its inception, team members quickly aligned, demonstrating complementary skill sets and strong chemistry. As training progressed, the team became mission-ready in a remarkably short time. Over the year, the team successfully executed two operations, further enhancing its resume and operational expertise. Moving forward, the team remains committed to continual improvement, striving to elevate its skill set and solidify its role as a vital asset to the region. The Cities of Kerrville, Fredericksburg, and Boerne combined their respective tactical units to create a regional team through an M.O.A.. From there, a hierarchy was established designating roles and responsibilities for missions and training evolutions. Commander, Team Leads, Operators, Operator specialties, Snipers, Tac Medics, Training Coordinator, Lead Instructors, and Support Instructors were amongst the more notable roles.







OFFICER ACCOMPLISHMENTS

K-9 CHICO & K-9 EMMA

Sergeant Pedro Moncada is the handler for K-9 Chico, a male Belgian Malinois that joined the department on November of 2023. Sergeant Moncada and Chico spend countless hours training in group settings and independently, even on their days off. K9 Chico had over 25 deployments in 2024. Their work has led to the seizures of firearms and harmful narcotics such as methamphetamine, cocaine, and heroin, and multiple arrests. K9 Chico is certified in locating marijuana, methamphetamine, and cocaine. Chico is also certified in tracking and suspect apprehension.

K9 Emma has served our department and community with distinction for the last 6 years, contributing to 172 Deployments, 7 patrol apprehensions, 125 narcotics arrests to include 123.9 kilos of Marijuana/THC, 2 kilos of methamphetamine, 6 kilos of cocaine and \$184,143 in US Currency.

LIEUTENANT JAMES SCHMIDT

Lieutenant James Schmidt was among 252 law enforcement officers from across the country and the world to graduate from the FBI National Academy Sept. 12, 2024. The academy invites only the top one percent of law enforcement officers to attend 10 weeks of advanced training in intelligence theory, management science, law, behavioral science, law enforcement communication, forensic science, and terrorism and terrorist mindsets. The officers who attend have, on average, 21 years of law enforcement experience and usually return to their agencies to serve in executive-level positions.





ED, SUICIDE, MH CRISIS OIS 2 YEAR COMPARISON


